Corn, oats, tobacco up

HARRISBURG — Based on September 1 conditions, Pennsylvania's 1981 production of corn for grain, oats and tobacco is expected to be above last year, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

Corn for grain production is forecast at a record high 123.7 million bushels, 29 percent more than a year ago and two percent more than the previous record set in 1979. Acreage for harvest is set for 1.33 million acres with a yield of 93.0 bushels per acre.

Oats production is forecast at 19.6 million bushels, three percent more than the previous year. Yield should average the same as last year at 56.0 bushels per acre.

Acreage harvested is estimated at 350,000 acres.

Tobacco production is forecast at 24.8 million pounds, slightly more than last year. Acreage for harvest is set for 13,600 acres with a yield of 1,825 pounds per acre currently indicated, compared with last year's yield of 1,900 pounds.

The grape crop is estimated to be the same last year's production of 56,000 tons.

Pasture condition throughout the Commonwealth averaged 73 percent, four percentage points above a year ago but eight percentage points below the 1970-79 average of this date.

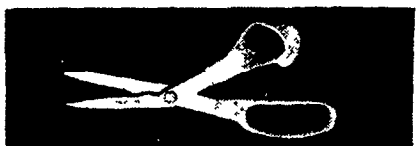
