York Society 12 entertained Society 14 recently at the Bethlehem Stonepile Church picnic building, Hallam.

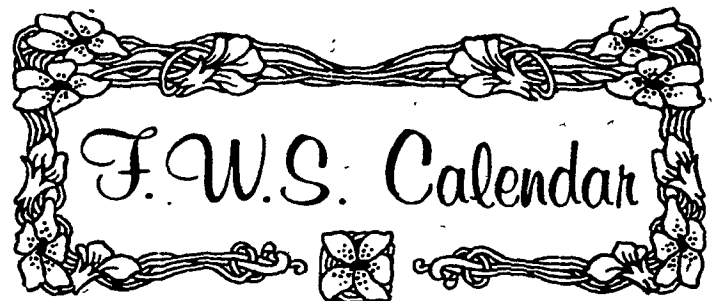

Penn State offers introductory income tax workshop

TOWANDA — An introductory Income Tax Workshop for beginning tax preparers, farmers preparing their own returns and others desiring to improve their tax skills will be conducted by Penn State Extension at three different locations in the state. The locations are Meadville, October 27 to 29, Carlisle, November 3 to 5 and Bedford, November 10 to 12.

Items covered will include methods of depreciation, investment tax credit, short and long-term capital gains (sale of cattle, real estate and stocks),

treatment of interest, dividends and royalties, how best to take advantage of Social Security benefits and related subjects.

You will receive instructions on how to prepare a federal 1040 form for individual or joint tax return (taking full advantage of exemptions, deductions and credit allowances) and how to get tax monies returned if you paid too much.

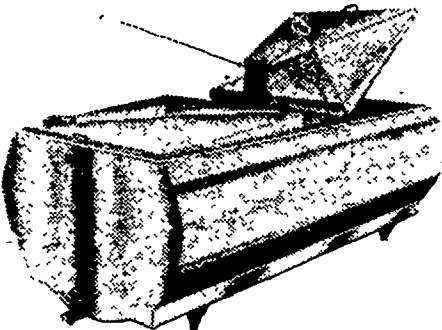

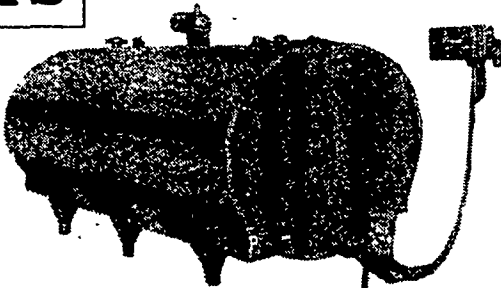
