

N.Y. cows take Holstein grand champs

HARRISBURG — The grand champion Holstein cow at yesterday's Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show was a four year old entry shown by Bower Farm Inc. of LaGrangeville, N.Y.

Judge Bertram Stewart exclaimed this Elevation daughter "spells dairy character. She's just the way we like to see a four year old."

Bred by Eric D. Anderson, this champion cow boasts a record set as a two-year-old of 22,857 pounds milk with 846 pounds fat and 3.7 test.

For reserve grand champion Judge Stewart went with the aged

cow entry of George B. Morgan, Tyrbach Holsteins, Walton, N.Y. He described this Ideal Fury Reflector daughter as "neat and clean." Bred by Mike Jones, Gay Fury Sadie is out of J & P Gaydale Matt Sadie.

An honorable mention was given to A Willowcrag Katie Mar Kara, a top three year old exhibited by Cromdale Farm, Inc. of Georgetown, Ontario. She is sired by Harborcrest Marcis out of Willowcrag Del-Matt Kate.

dairymen, Bernard and David Wagner, the Glendell daughter, is out of an Elevation and made an impressive 35,756 pounds of milk as a 4-year-old and plus 20,000 as a first-calf heifer.

Jackson Enterprises, Clayton, Ohio, paid \$15,000 for a Jet Stream daughter out of an Ivanhoe Star. Pack-Herd Jet Stream Tiara is a 4-year-old that has not made a record below 20,000 and is projected at 23,591 pounds of milk.

The Tiara cow was consigned by Richard and Marilyn Packard, Troy. Due in November to Glendell Arlinda Chief, the Jet Stream

daughter brought the second-high price.

A nine-month-old Kingpin daughter brought the sale's third-high bid with a price tag of \$14,000. Stardell Farms, Frederick, Md. purchased Leadfield Petro Pint-ET, consigned by Leadfield Associates, Jamestown. The heifer is out of C Craigo Petro Telstar, a 4E, 96 Gold Medal Dam. The Telstar cow has a lifetime record of more than 150,000 pounds of milk and has four progeny nominated All-American or All-Canadian.

Before the sale, prospective buyers and wishful thinkers had a chance to quench their thirsts and appetites at the milk and cheese bar in the sale barn.

HARRISBURG — A senior yearling heifer from Sky Vu Farms, Hastings, Minnesota, captured the Junior Champion title as out-of-state entries dominated the first day of the Eastern National Holstein Show, Thursday.

Sky Vu Ultimate Lestwood is owned by Paul and Judy Trapp and Canadian breeders, the Roundtree Family from Brampton, Ontario. The junior champ, a Quality Ultimate is out of Stopp in

Astronaut Leslie and due to Elevation around Christmas.

Judge Bertram Stewart, a Canadian Holstein breeder, selected the second place senior yearling as Reserve Junior Champ. Pehrson-Hyline Chris Lola is owned by Douglas Maddox of Ru Ann Holsteins, Inc. Bred to Vir-Clar Bootmaker Deluxe, the reserve junior champ is sired by Brondale Sir Christopher. The Christopher bull also sired

the Grand Champion Bull, International Genpendro, a senior yearling. The champ, also named Junior Champion Bull, is owned by David Bachmann of Pinehurst Farms Sheboygan Falls, Wisconsin.

Judge Stewart went with Whippoorwill King Bonanza for Reserve Grand Champion owned by Whippoorwill Farm, Manchester, Minnesota. The reserve
