

Lanc. Co. youths win contest

HARRISBURG — Two Lancaster County youths were named outstanding individuals, Tuesday, during the Seventh Pennsylvania 4-H and FFA Dairy Judging Forum at the Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show.

Kevin Roth of New Holland, representing the Grasslands FFA Chapter was the top FFA individual with a score of 373 from a possible score of 400 points. Gerald Garber of Willow Street, led the 4-

H individual competition with a score of 370 points from a possible 400.

A total of 427 contestants judged seven classes of dairy cattle, featuring some of the best animals in the nation on exhibit at the All-American. This included five cow classes and two heifer classes. A quiz on dairy herd management was also given.

Placing second through fifth in the FFA competition were:

Kenneth Holtry of Shippensburg, with 364 points; second went to Glenn Kline of Troy, with 349 points; Keith Aelg of Grantville, with 346 points; and Karyn England of Williamsburg, with 345 points.

In the individual 4-H competition, Jack R. Thomas of Ulysses, placed second with 366 points; third went to Ken Hoover of Martinsburg, with 362 points; Darrell Clapper of Martinsburg

placed fourth with 359 points; and John Clowney of Gettysburg, placed fifth with 355 points.

The Blair County 4-H team picked up top honors against 12 other 4-H teams, with 1070 points from a possible 1200. Team members included Brian and Susanne Kelly of Tyrone, Ken Hoover and Darrell Clapper.

The second place 4-H team represented Berks County and accumulated 1015 points. Team members included Patti Dreisbach of Hamburg, Charles Seidel of Lenhartsville, William Leshar of Bernville and Todd Miller of Hamburg.

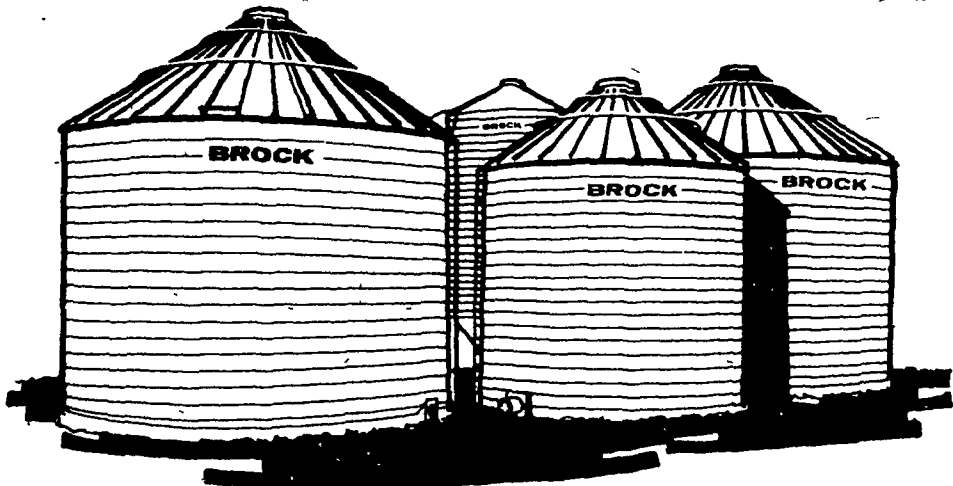
Chester County placed third with 999 points. Team members included Glenn Stoltzfus of Morgantown, Tim Kurtz of Elverson, Susan Kulp and Darrell Guest of Pottstown.

The Grassland FFA Chapter from Lancaster County took top honors in the FFA team competition with 1043 points. There were 32 FFA teams competing. Team members were Darrell Gockley of Mohnton, Kevin Roth of New Holland, Carolyn Witmer of East Earl, and Ronald Martin of Narvon.

The Northern Bedford FFA Chapter placed second with a score of 998. Their team was comprised of Todd Hall of Hopewell, Beth Smith and Mark Swope of Roaring Spring, and Harry Brubaker from New Enterprise.

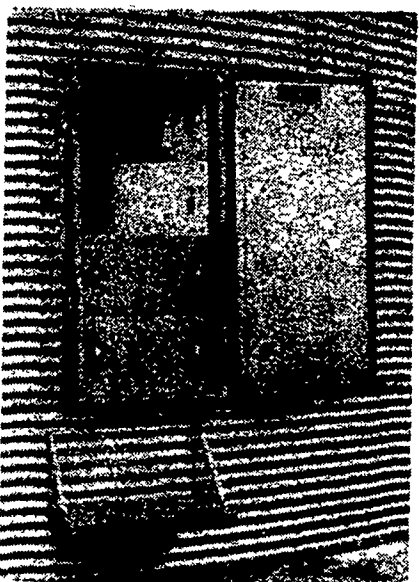

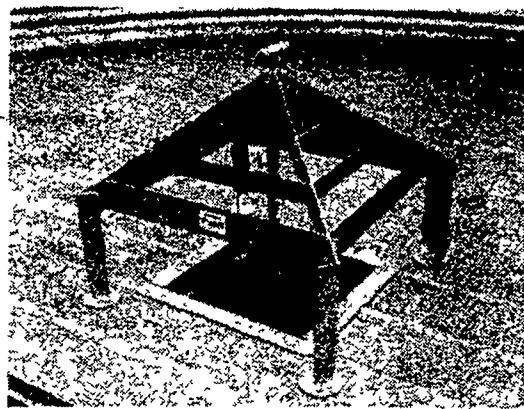
