## LMA want Packers & Stockyards public hearing

KANSAS CITY, Mo. - The Board of Directors of Livestock Marketing Association voted unanimously here recently to ask for public hearings on the Pack and Stockyards Administration's internal review of PosS Act

regulations and policy statements. In a petition to U.S. Department

of Agriculture Secretary John R. Block, LMA's law firm noted that the P&S review "Task Force" was

public hearings "so that those persons who will be affected by the regulations" can offer their views, the petition said.

LMA's petition also said there has been "little progress made, and few tangible results" since P&S began reviewing current regulations and policy statements in December, 1979. That review was begun in response to federal law and a presidential executive order, LMA officials pointed out.

82-page report has been given wide circulation throughout the entire livestock industry and to state government officials, -LMA officials said.

In spite of this, the Task Force's regional supervisors Griffin Bonham of Omaha, C. DeWayne Crawford of Indianapolis and T.C. Harris of Bedford, Va., and from the USDA Office of General Counsel, Attorneys Thomas M. Walsh and Kenneth H. Vail.

Hearings to allow the livestock industry to comment on the report are crucial, the petition said, since the report "will undoubtedly be used as the basic guidelines for the P&S's revised review of the P&S regulations." This revised review is scheduled to be completed by the close of fiscal 1983, according to P&S officials.

"Meaningful, substantive" comments from the livestock in dustry are needed "so that review can proceed to completion." the petition said.
