
### Simmental Assoc. names trait leaders

BOZEMAN, Mt. - The American Siminental Association has announced that 75 purebred Simmental bulls, including 14 that qualified in more than one category, have been recognized as Trait Leaders for 1982.

Based on data contained in the 1982 National Simmental Sire Summary, which is currently being printed, these Trait Leaders include builts whose progeny lead the breed in six important economic traits; calving ease, weaning weight, yearling weight, carcass value, daughters' first calt calving ease, and daughters' first calf weaning weight.

"Trait Leader recognition is based upon an evaluation of progeny performance records from 1,300 bulls listed in the 1982 Sire Summary", said Executive Vice President Earl B. Peterson. A total of 458,684 performance records from 44,003 management units were considered.

All Summental bulls that meet qualifying progeny standards are included in the ASA Sire Summary, and are thus eligible for consideration as Genetic Trait Leaders. A bull may be named in more than one trait, provided his progeny rank in the top two percent of those recorded in the specified trait.
