

# Bloomsburg Fair features record Holstein entries

**BLOOMSBURG** — Not only did this year's Bloomsburg Fair, one of the largest in the state, attract thousands of people but a record number of Black and Whites also showed up Wednesday for the second day of the Fair's Dairy Show, according to livestock superintendent Fred Giger.

More than 200 Holsteins from the central and eastern sections of the state paraded in the main arena. But the one name that consistently appeared in the winners column was Globe Run Farm, Petersburg. Not surprisingly, the Premier Breeder and Exhibitor banners hung above the Globe Run tack box by the end of the day.

Globe Run Holsteins, exhibited by John Foster, Jr., racked up several individual wins and swept the majority of the group classes. However, the feather in the cap was Foster's 3-year-old cow which was named grand champion.

Globe Run Fawn Honor Litton, owned by Annabelle and John Foster, Sr., is sired by Rocby Apollo Fawn Honor and out of Globe Run Chief Marty Lady. The grand champ was first in Pennsylvania at the All-American and is projected at more than 20,000 pounds of milk.

Reserve Grand Champion honors went to Fra-Jan Farm, Orangeville. It was the first time this year that Frank Jurbala exhibited his aged cow, Lo-Pine Ivy Edith. Bred to Valiant, the reserve champ is sired by Sterk Ivy Telstar and out of Lo-Pine Nobleman Ester.

Sordoni Sterling Farm, Inc., Harvey's Lake, claimed two Champion ribbons before the day ended. Early in the competition Sterlinggold Arlinda Chief, a junior yearling bull was named grand champion bull. Sired by Pawnee Farm Arlinda Chief, the champ is out of C Welcome Instigator Lisa.

The second Champion ribbon was awarded to another young animal, Sterlinggold Citamatt Tillie. The senior yearling heifer, sired by Sir Glenridge Citamatt was the junior champion.

Jean LeVan's senior heifer calf, Wynding-Brook Jemini Charity, captured Reserve Junior Champion honors. The Milton 4-H'er was also selected as champion showman and fitter in the senior division.

Sandsdale Winston Tippy exhibited by Sandsdale Farms, Wyoming, was named reserve champion bull. The bull calf, owned by Ralph Sands, is sired by Edeal Pinonia Matt Tippy and out of Sunrest Sovereign Win-I-win. Additional results of the Bloomsburg Fair Holstein Dairy Show follow:
