The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Wychock, Kathleen is a senior at Crestwood High School. She has been a 4-H member for nine years.

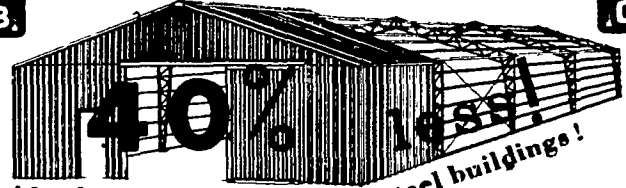
A member of the Mountaintop Clovers 4-H Club, she served as president, vice president,

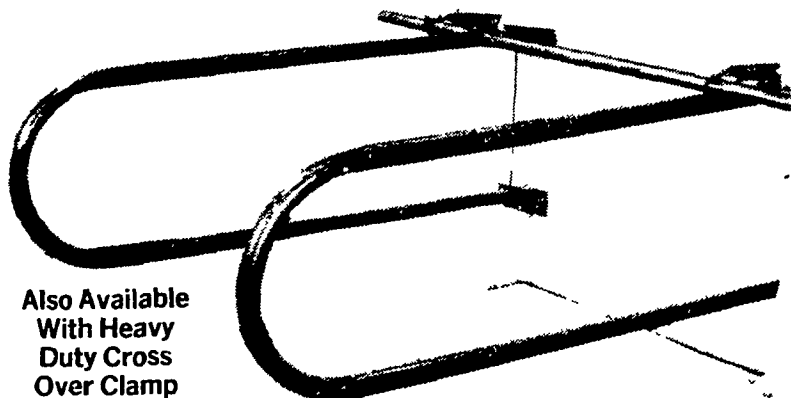
