

Sattazahns' 6214 SLURRYSTORE will handle manure from 100 head of milk cows and 70 head of heifers and young stock. A new 100' x 52' heifer barn houses young stock on the farm. 140 acres of corn, along with 70 acres of alfalfa and 20 acres of small grain are grown on the farm. A Nesseth Piston Ram Pump and a DeLaval/Sahlstrom TH60 Pump handle all manure in the Sattazahns' SLURRYSTORE System. Dairy cows are fed HARVESTORE High Moisture Corn, Haylage & Cornlage and are milked in a 8-cow Bou-Matic Carousel Parlor.

Aaron and Luke farm 200 acres and milk 68 cows on this Lebanon County dairy farm. The 6214 SLURRYSTORE was completed this past summer. Cows are housed in free stalls and milked in a milking parlor. HARVESTORE processed corn, alfalfa and double-cropped small grains are fed to the dairy herd. Manure from the free stalls is scraped into a reception pit then pumped into the SLURRYSTORE with a Pit Pump.





Reists milk 94 mature cows in their stanchion barn. Manure from the barn is pumped into a 6214 SLURRYSTORE with a Nesseth Piston Ram Pump. Agitation for the SLURRYSTORE and spreader filling is done with a Nesseth Side-Mount Pump. Gutter grates and rubber mats are used in the stanchion barn. Plowdown fertilizer has been completely eliminated on this farm with a 13-ton application of slurry per acre.
