Bedford County offers production contest

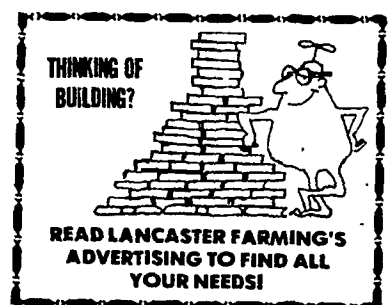

Records should have been completed between October 1, 1980 and September 30, 1981. Plaque awards will be made at the Annual

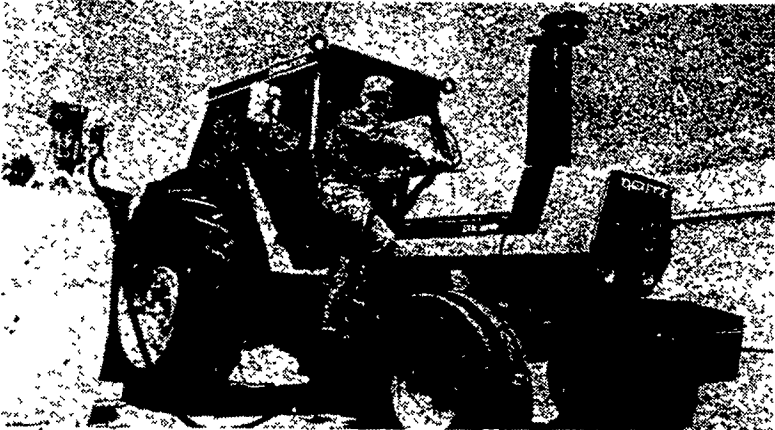
Meeting in November for the high 2-year-old, 3-year-old, 4-H or FFA cow, 4-year-old and aged cow.

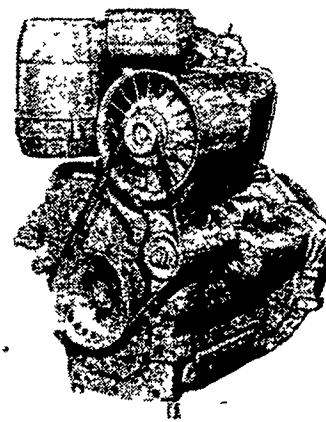
