? That's A ? Good Question

Does anyone know where to buy a coriander grinder, or any other type of grinder that would work to grind seeds? I tried a blender and other types, but the results were not too good.

The Lancaster County Extension service recommended trying herb and spice shops in your area. After contacting a herb shop in the Lititz area, we found that coriander grinders are very scarce and expensive. They recommended trying a pepper mill first. This should grind the seeds completely as would any coriander or spice grinder since coriander is actually a type of spice anyway.

Would you know where to find Dexter pygmy cattle, pygmy goats, and geese in this area?

Ag Arena consignment numbers continue to grow

UNIVERSITY PARK — Livestock producers continue to consign animals to an all-breeds sale to aid Penn State's Ag Arena fund raising project.

The sale will be held December 11 in Harrisburg's Farm Show Complex. Proceeds will go toward the construction of the 190,000-

square-foot facility to be located adjacent to Beaver Stadium.

The Ag Arena will provide for student classes and laboratories. It also will be available for statewide shows and sales by agricultural groups. Over 20 percent of the estimated \$900,000 cost has been raised to date.

Consignments now total 119, according to Milford Heddleson, College of Agriculture coordinator of environmental quality affairs and co-chairman of the fund raising campaign.

"Breeders who consign beef, sheep, swine, and dairy animals are being asked to donate at least 50 percent of the sale price to the building fund," the co-chairman points out. "Breed associations are participating in securing and

selecting consignments."
