

Pa. exhibitors win in KILE junior and open steer shows

HARRISBURG — The Open and Junior Steer Shows at the Keystone International Livestock Exposition held Sunday at the Farm Show Complex found a number of Pennsylvania exhibitors leading champion entries.

The reserve grand champion steer of the junior show went to an entry of Bethene Summers of Bloomsburg, Columbia County. Summers' entry was also reserve champion in the open show.

The reserve champion steer of the junior show was exhibited by Blaine Clouser of Dayton, Armstrong County. Clouser's entry had previously been named the reserve champion steer in the heavyweight competition.

Brenton Upperman of Chambersburg, Franklin County, showed both the champion and reserve champion of the middleweight division.

In the lightweight division, Kaye Sweigard of Halifax, Dauphin County, showed the champion steer, while Dauphin Countian Tim Foreman of Hershey exhibited the reserve champion lightweight steer.

Kevin Kropp of Troy, Ohio, exhibited the grand champion steer of the show, winning champion open steer and junior champion.

During the junior steer competition, Jane Prouty of Norwich, Ohio, exhibited the champion steer of the junior show. Her steer won the heavyweight class.

Judging this year's show was A. L. Eller, Jr. of Blackburg, Virginia. The Livestock Exposition is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Livestock Association in

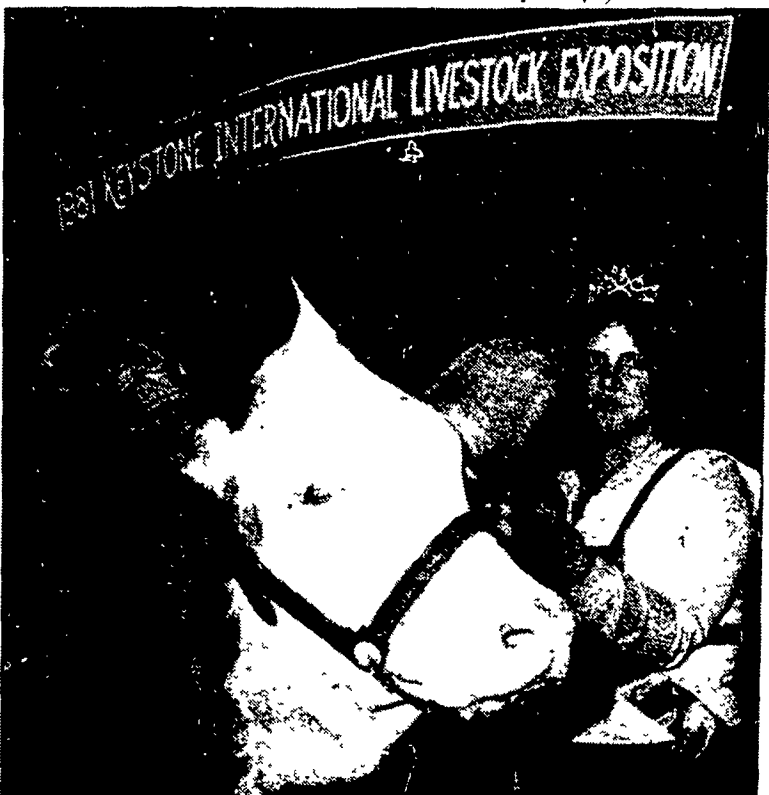
Pa. juniors exhibit top breeding cattle

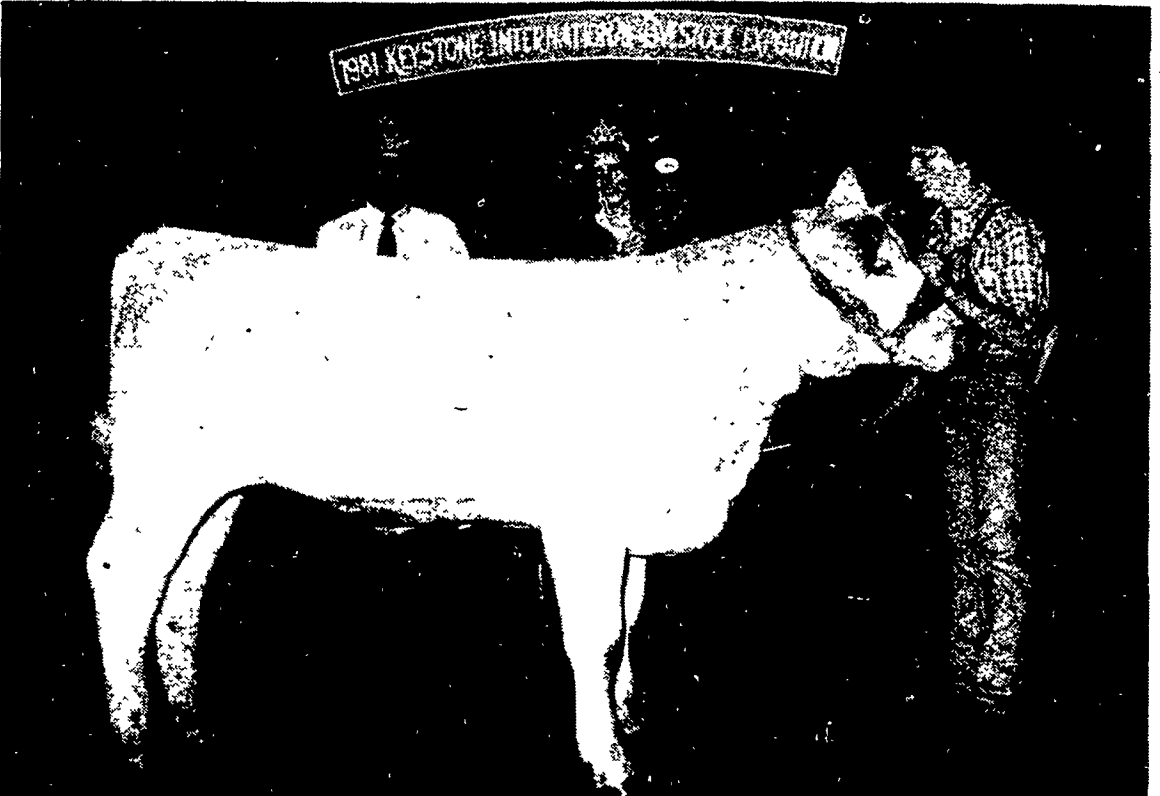
Brian Patz of Greensburg, Westmoreland County, swept the Charolais show with his entries. RCC Royal R Tempress 3383, a late summer yearling, was named grand champion female after winning the senior champion title. Patz also showed the reserve grand champion Charolais, CSM

MS Expectation 3225, a spring yearling. Carla Loraine Clutter of Prosperity, Washington County, showed RCC Royal R Tempress 3410, a senior calf, to the junior champion female title.

Dauphin County entries were in the winners circle during the Junior Simmental Show. Sarah Anne Messick of Middletown showed Rennie, a late junior yearling, to the grand champion heifer title. Rennie has been named reserve grand champion heifer of the Open Simmental Show. Joseph M. Messick, also of Middletown, exhibited the reserve junior champion heifer. His entry,

EVF Ms. Wind Chill was named reserve champion heifer. This senior heifer calf, shown by Stephanie Earnhart of Leetonia, Ohio, had been named reserve

champion heifer calf of the Dr. Frank Perrone Standard of Perfection Polled Hereford Show earlier this week.

Another Ohio exhibitor, Jennifer Quaintance of Springfield, showed the champion Hereford heifer. Her entry was BH Ms. Tiberius 80107, a spring yearling.

In the Junior Shorthorn competition, Virginia entries won both championships. Rhonda Kay Kibler of Woodstock exhibited the champion heifer, KRK Crystal, a junior heifer calf. The reserve champion heifer was shown by

Brad Douthit of Orange, Virginia. His entry was Windholme Ruby 270, an early spring yearling. Kibler also showed the best female bred and owned by exhibitor, while Berks Countian Kenianne Rarick of Reading placed second.

BF Caroline's Playgirl topped the Junior Angus Show. This April junior yearling heifer was exhibited by Dawn Bippert of Alden, New York. Deborah M. Rishel of McCordsville, Indiana, showed Evelyn Marie 001 of RAF, a March junior yearling heifer, to
