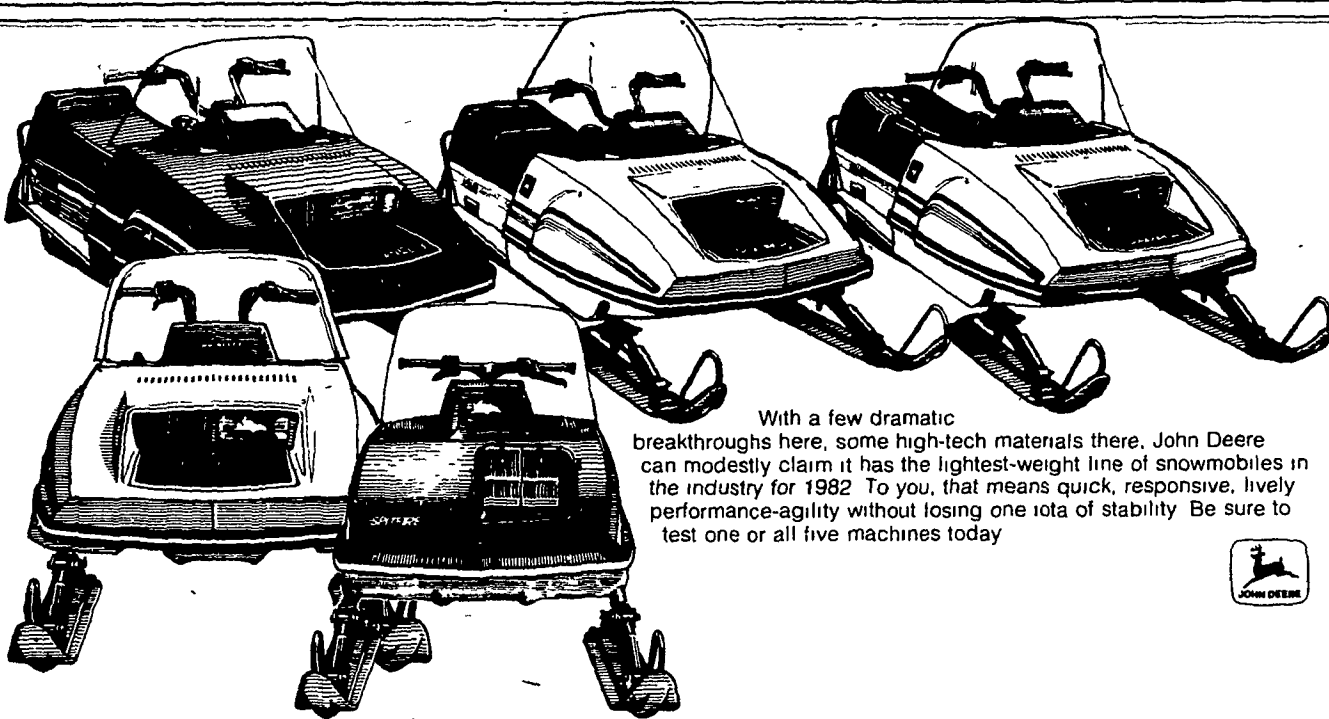
August 1981
Cumberland County Dairy Herd Improvement records show that 7472.0 cows in 125 herds were on production testing in August according to Duane G. Duncan, County Agent. Of the 103 herds on DHIA, 37 herds had an average fat production of 1.50 pounds per cow per day for the month. During the month 137 completed their 305 lactation with 650 lbs. of butterfat. DHIA Supervisors working with the dairymen to improve efficiency include Harold Boldosser, 130 Old Gap Road, Carlisle; Paul Wynn, RD #1, Box 88, Newburg; Jay Zeigler, RD #1, Carlisle; and John Rolar, RD #2, Newville. The following are the highest of actual butterfat in 305 days or less in the county during the month. The age listed is her age at the time of freshening.
