

Drawbar horsepower. The most basic criterion is how much can it pull, as measured in horsepower at the drawbar This is more important than engine horsepower because the drawbar is the working end of the tractor



Cost per drawbar horse-power. This is the real way to measure what you're getting for the money Just divide the cost by the tested drawbar horsepower and you've got a figure you can use to compare all makes and types of tractors
