## Fall is fine time to lime

excellent time to apply lime for many reasons.

Lime requires time to react with the soil: it doesn't work overnight. Applying lime in the fall provides the necessary time for the neutralization of soil acidity before spring planting.

Lime is most effective when it is mixed with the soil. Given time. nature does a good job of mixing lime and soil. Rain water percolating into the soil, freezing and thawing, and wetting and drying, all contribute to working the lime into the soil. The action of nature in mixing lime into the soil is important on no-till espec\* fields and permanent pastures. This is a big plus for fall liming.

A common liming problem today is the release of residual herbicides when a very acid soil is limed. If you are rotating from corn to a sensitive crop such as oats or alfalfa, the release of tiedup herbicides by spring liming can

Liming ahead of time, at least in the fall before you anticipate planting a sensitive crop, will allow some time for the released herbicides to dissipate. It is even better if you can lime a full year ahead of planting a herbicidesensitive crop. Better yet, eliminate the problem by maintaining the soil pH between 6.5 and 7.0 throughout the whole rotation.

Another very practical advantage to fall liming is that lime and lime spreading services are more available in the fall than during the busy spring season. Also, because the soil is usually drier in the fall, there is less chance of doing physical damage to it.

If you are planning to lime this fall, the first and most important step is to get your soil tested. This is the only way to find out if lime is needed, and how much to apply.


