Four puppies had arrived in the county in the early summer. These pupples are now six months old.




The pupples stay with the 4-H'ers for one year. In the past few months, they have received many requests to take the pupples to service clubs for presentations.

The big supporter of the program in Lancaster County is the PA Lions Club - 2nd leaders in the nation in helping the blind.


