Poor soybean harvest practices throw away profits

NEWARK, Del. — Don't throw away your profits on poor harvest practices.

"Soybean growers can add as much as \$18 per acre to their returns this fall through better harvest management," says Tom Williams, Extension agricultural engineer at the University of Delaware.

The average grower, he says, loses as much as three bushels per acre through poor harvest With today's management. soybean prices close to \$6 per bushel, there's good monetary incentive for producers to harvest as many beans as possible.

Here are some of Williams' recommendations for a more profitable soybean harvest:

Begain harvesting when sovbean seed moisture reaches 14 percent.

Shatter losses increase markedly when moisture levels drop below 11.5 percent.

Harvest at an average combine speed between 2.8 and 3 miles per hour. Combines operate most efficiently at that range - and the cutter bar is allowed to ride down for maximum cut. Row crop headers can be operated up to 5 miles per hour under ideal conditions.

Count lost soybeans already on the ground before harvest; preharvest losses should not be charged against combining. Four beans per square foot indicate a bushel lost per acre for largeseeded varieties. Five beans per square foot for small seeded varieties equals one bushel per

Match ground speed to combine

reel speed. Best speed ratio is a reel speed of 1.25 times the combine ground speed. Reel axle 6 to 12 inches ahead of cutter bar.

Cut soybeans as close to the ground as possible. The goal is to

harvest all the pods-even the very lowest. Tests show a 10-percent reduction in harvest losses when soybeans are cut at 2 1/2 inches. Floating and flexible cutter bars 'substantially reduce this har-

Measure. soybean losses from cutting, gathering, and threshing operations to pinpoint necessary adjustments.

Continually adjust the combine to changing crop conditions.
