# On being a farm wife -And other hazards

This should be a week of two-fold rejoicing for farm women.

Not only does November 1 usher in National Farm Wife Month, but on Tuesday, we can exercise a right won only after a long a bitter struggle begun by our foremothers more than a century ago.

Pioneer farm women were among the earliest proponents of women's rights to vote.

Accustomed to battling the hardships of the West right up there alongside their men, those western farm wives earned their place at the polling table, at least for some state elections, nearly a half-century before the women of

In fact, it was August of 1920. when the 19th Amendment to the Constitution became part of the law of the land, before Pennsylvania women won their right at the ballot box.

You see, back East here in these more "civilized" parts, it was generally believed, at least by the male half of the population, that a woman didn't have enough judgement to choose a political candidate, based on the argument that a woman's reasoning powers were not equal to those of a man.

Good ole' Susan B. Anthony (honored on those ill-fated coin dollars collecting dust in bank

vaults) was one of the women who worked her heart out to change those lunatic opinions. And it was an uphill struggle all the way, similar to the current drive to ratify the ERA amendment.

A noted female American novelist and poet, Alice Duer Miller, poked a little sarcasm at the whole issue back in 1915 when she penned the following reasons "Why We Oppose Votes For Men."

- Because a man's place is in

- Because no really manly man wants to settle any question otherwise than by fighting about it.

- Because if men should adopt peaceable methods, women will no longer look up to them.

- Because men will lose their charm if they step out of their natural sphere and interest themselves in other matters than feats of arms, uniforms and drums.

- Because men are too emotional to vote. Their conduct at baseball games and political conventions shows this, while their innate tendency to appeal to force renders them particularly unfit for the task of government.

So, for goodness sake, even if you don't like Susan B's dollar, at least support her cause.

Go vote on Tuesday.
