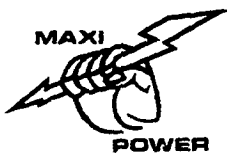
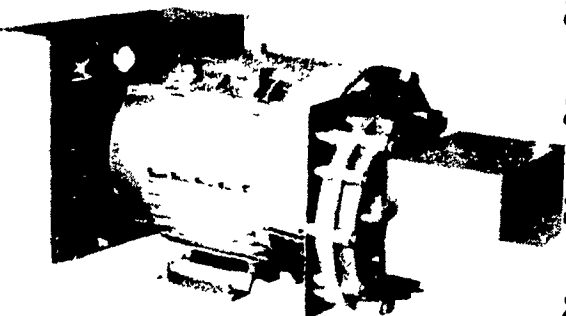

cumulate "bot fly" larvae that grow in the stomach. Medication for "bots" fortunately kills some other types of worms, says Dr. Hammond. Treatment for internal parasites such as bots, which reproduce during the summer months should be administered after the first frost. Others insect-borne diseases such as sleeping sickness, which is transferred by mosquitos, should be treated in the spring.
Horses should be vaccinated

every year against tetanus, especially in the fall when they may get injured and be exposed to tetanus in the stable.

With proper precautions taken in advance, give your horse daily attention and seek help or advice if you need it.

Horse care should be "a cooperative thing of correct timing between the horseowner and the veterinarian," Dr. Hammond says, "So that they can talk over the things that need to be done when they need to be done."
