## Del. irrigation conference coming Nov. 24

NEWARK, Del. - This year's Delaware Irrigation Conference will be held Tuesday, November 24, at the Sheraton Inn in Dover. Doors will open at 8:30 a.m. for registration and a visit to exhibits. The program will start at 9:30 and end at 3:30 p.m.


Highlights of the meeting will be a talk by Florida Extension agronomist Dave Wright on a production system for 200 bushel corn, and a presentation by New Jersey Extension agronomist Roy Flannery on his experience growing 312 bushel corn and 94 bushel soybeans.

Other topics to be covered include: problem solving with aerial photography; corn water use and irrigation requirements; and application of pesticides through irrigation systems. The conference will close with a panel of Delaware growers discussing their experiences with irrigation.


