

# Hunters should ask permission to hunt

HARRISBURG — The Pennsylvania Game Commission is making a special appeal to all hunters to ask for permission before going onto private land.

In recent years, increasing numbers of landowners have complained to the wildlife management agency that more and more hunters barge onto private property without first getting permission to do so. Part of the response has been the SPORT (Sportsmen Policing Our Ranks Together) program, which promotes ethical hunting conduct.

Complaining landowners, many of whom participate in the SPORT program, do not generally object to hunting or hunters, but they feel they are entitled to more courtesy and consideration than has been shown in the past.

The landowners are ready to grant permission to hunt if it is sought by responsible sportsmen. Those wearing SPORT buttons or similar identification

are usually readily welcomed.

Farmers who are harvesting fall crops want to know where hunters are on their properties. Sportsmen must avoid unharvested

fields, leave gates as they found them, be careful not to litter, avoid breaking down fences, stay away from buildings and livestock, park where vehicles won't interfere with

farm equipment, share game with their hosts, and show all other common hunting courtesies.

Those who hunt

without asking permission or otherwise irritate landowners risk the closure of private properties to all hunters.

## No spotlighting with weapon in vehicles

HARRISBURG — Those accustomed to spotlighting game and furbearers from vehicles are reminded by the Game Commission that it now is unlawful to spotlight while in possession of a firearm, bow or other implement which could be used to kill wildlife.

Previously, it was not unlawful to spotlight with a firearm in the vehicle unless the light

was cast upon a big game animal. Recently, the Game Law was amended to prohibit spotlighting while in possession of a gun or bow and arrow. It no longer is necessary for the light to be shining on big game to be unlawful.

A \$25 penalty is provided for spotlighting while in possession of a firearm or bow and arrow.

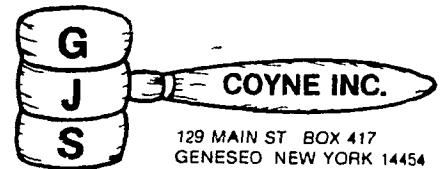
