

Turkey hunters must be careful

HARRISBURG — Safety specialists for the Pennsylvania Game Commission have issued a special appeal to hunters to take extra precautions during the fall turkey seasons.

Turkey hunting accidents are of concern to Hunter Education Coordinator James Filkosky, who says, "75 percent of all persons shot in mistake for game in Pennsylvania last year were thought to be turkeys."

"Some of the victims were concealed in heavy cover, wore camouflage material and were attempting to call in birds," noted Filkosky. "This method is turkey hunting at its finest, but unfortunately some hunters apparently are shooting at what they believe are sounds and movements."

Pennsylvania's army of turkey hunters is growing rapidly, and it's incumbent upon every hunter to be absolutely sure of his or her target before firing. If the hunter positively

identifies a turkey, human will be shot in there is no chance that a mistake.

Fed. Grain Advisory to meet Nov. 13

WASHINGTON, D.C.

— The first meeting of the recently formed U.S. Grain Standards Act Advisory committee will be held in Washington D.C. Nov. 13.

The meeting, which is open to the public, will start at 9:30 a.m. in room 5066 of USDA's South Building, 14th and Independence Ave. S.W., and is scheduled to end by 4 p.m.

Although the meeting is open to the public, participation by persons other than committee members will be limited to written statements submitted before or during the meeting to public participation as time permits.

C.W. McMillan, assistant secretary of agriculture for marketing and inspection services, said the purpose of the committee is to advise the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Federal Grain Inspection Service on the efficient and economical implementation of the U.S. Grain Standards Act.

McMillan will serve as committee chairman and Kenneth A. Gilles, administrator of the Federal Grain Inspection Service, will serve as vice chairman.

Notice of the meeting was published in the Oct. 26 Federal Register.
