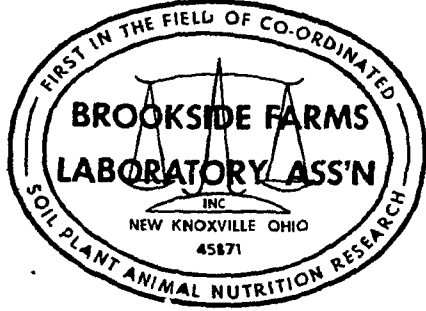

Slaughter steers and heifers posted the first higher close in at least six weeks after a further price downturn was pressured Monday when receipts swelled to 7,600 head. The trade more than recovered early losses with curtailed receipts and price advances for carcass and boxed beef the factors. Slaughter steers made up about 35 pct. of the estimated five day total; heifers 23 pct. Cows continued in small supply, 4 pct.; feeders, including Friday's auction, 36 pct.

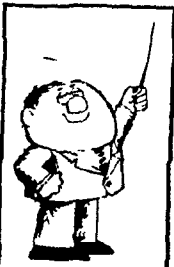

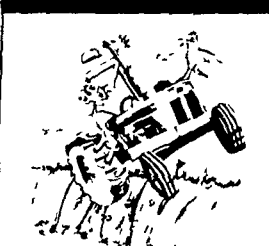
