

DVC finishes with top Bucks Co. DHIA average

DOYLESTOWN — The Bucks County Dairy Herd Improvement Association finished its 58th year September 30 with 55 whole-year members, three AM-PM members and three Owner-Sampler members.

The county's 3,261 cows on test averaged 15,861 pounds of milk and 606 pounds of butterfat.

Delaware Valley College, Doylestown, topped the county herd average with 20,579 pounds of milk and 742 pounds of butterfat on 44.1 registered Holsteins.

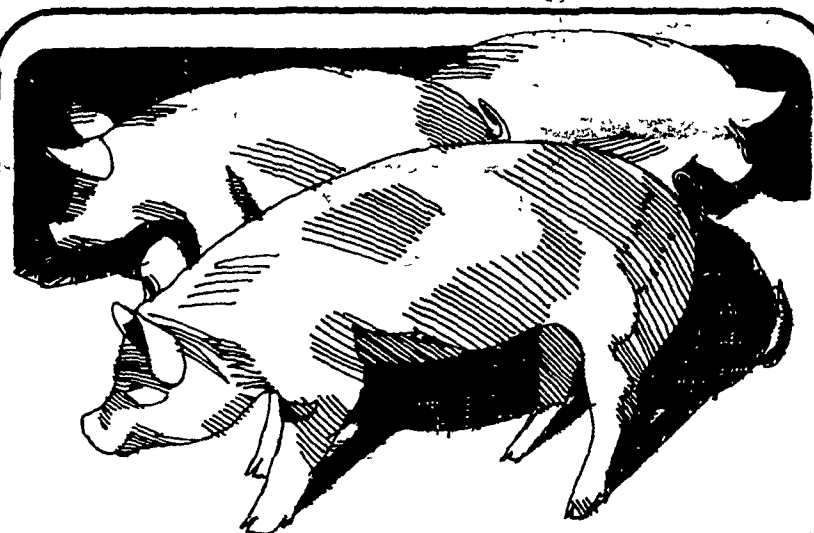
Clarion Co. DHIA 1981 testing

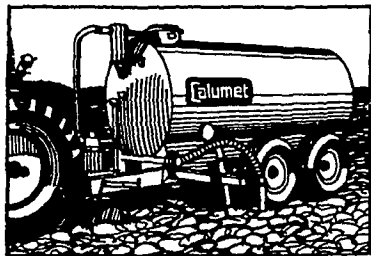

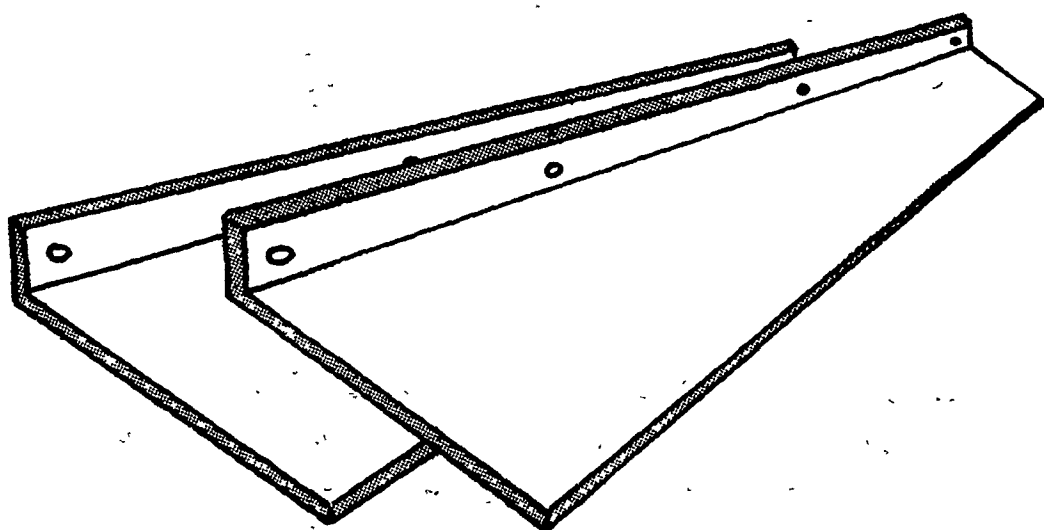
