The honors were presented by Debra Gregory, 4-H coordinator, at Bucks County 4-H Awards Night held November 28, at Tyro Hall Grange, Buckingham.

Betsy Hottle and Charlene Gormley were selected for the award in recognition of excellence in character and personal development as well as leadership potential.

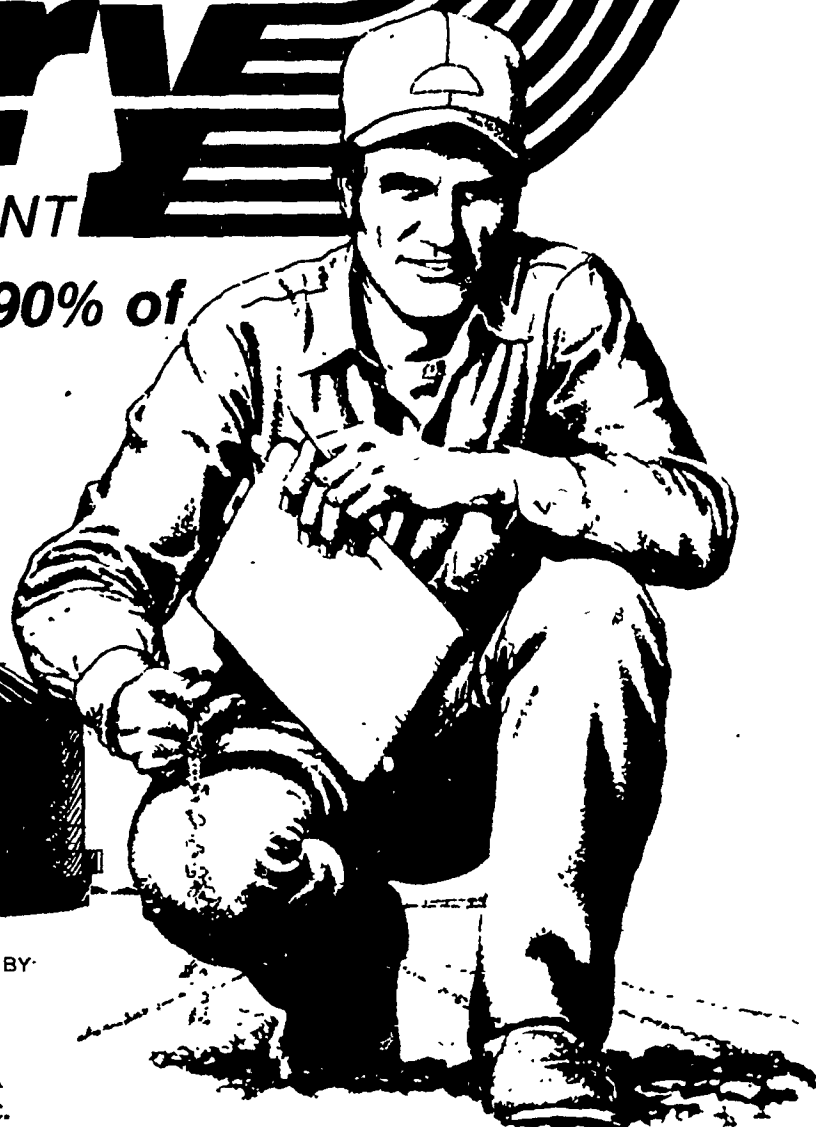
