Vegetable conference coming Jan. 26-28

portant tomato and small fruit . handling and storing muskmelons production practices, culture for other key vegetable crops, and financial management will be featured topics at the 1982 Pennsylvania Vegetable Conference and Trade Show scheduled for January 26-28 at the Hershey Convention Center, Hershey.

According to Peter Ferretti, Extension vegetable crops specialist at Penn State, 19 state, 13 out-of-state, and two Canadian authorities in various fields will be presenting up-to-date details on numerous subjects that are of major importance to Commonwealth vegetable and small fruit growers.

The conference is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Vegetable Growers Association, Penn State College of Agriculture, and Pennsylvania Food Processors Association, in cooperation with the State Horticultural Association of Pennsylvania.

The January 26 morning session has been set aside for those interested in tomato production. Topics to be covered include new fresh market varieties; disease resistance to Eastern processing tomato varieties; effective early blight control; gel seeding; banding fertilizers; and controlling the Colorado potato beetle.

The Tomato Awards Luncheon will be held at noon on January 26. At the luncheon, the top winners in the 1981 Tomato Growers Contest will be honored.

The Tuesday afternoon program, a joint session with the State Horticultural Association and fruit growers of Maryland and New Jersey, will focus on financial management, weather, and energy.

What's new in cultural practices will be the theme of the January 27

UNIVERSITY PARK - Im- morning session. Subjects include during and after harvest; the newest in sweet corn, bean, pepper, and vine crop varieties; how to grow and sell bedding plants; electronic deer fences; and a comparison. of airblast, boom, airplane, and helicopter spray coverage.


On the afternoon of January 27, several disease, weed, and insect control topics will be covered by two Penn State plus four out-ofstate speakers. One of the subjects to be covered will be integrated pest management strategies for controlling cabbage and snap bean pests.

"Wednesday evening will feature the Vegetable Growers Annual Banquet," Ferretti points out.

Small fruit production practices will be dealt with on January 28, with concurrent joint sessions for vegetable growers and fruit society members. Subjects include pruning and training thornless blackberrries; strawberry weed control systems; and blueberry production practices.


