Composted waste can save growers money

DLLEGE PARK, Md. — ` hmercial growers in the nur-, landscape, greenhouse and len center industries can rove plant quality, save money conserve natural resources if use composted waste for amental crops, according to a earch scientist with the ryland Agricultural Exment Station. -

hrough advanced composting mology, municipal and icultural waste can be conted into compost products hin 60 days, says Francis R. un, MAES researcher and fessor of horticulture at the versity of Maryland, College

When used at recommended es, these composted products be used to improve depleted sery soils, assist in reclaiming ned areas and amend potting xes for growing nursery and enhouse crops," Gouin says. In addition to substituting for

moss; the compost also will aid in reducing the lime and fertilizer needs of these industries,' he says.

"Composted municipal and in nutrients essential for plant growth," adds Gouin. He points out however, that he is not recommending sludge compost for use on food crops for human comsumption except for growing vegetable bedding plants for transplanting into the garden.

In a paper presented to the Biological Management of Industrial Wastes Symposium in Philadelphia last month. Gouin outlined current organic matter consumption by commercial growers.

In Maryland, growers from nursery, landscape, greenhouse and garden center industries use an average of 600 tons of organic matter each day, says Gouin. Most of the organic matter is in the form

milled pine bark and some peat of peat moss, milled pine or leafmold.

Most of that peat moss, he explains, is imported from the Canadian provinces of Nova Scotia agricultural waste sludges are rich and New Brunswick, while milled pine bark is trucked from the


"With an increasing number of ornamentals being grown in containers and greater use of raised planters in both interior and exterior landscapes, the demand for organic matter is likely to increase," adds Gouin.

By using composted waste, on

the other hand, Gouin says growers will maintain or improve the quality of their plants and save money while doing it.

At the same time, he adds, "they will be contributing significantly to the national efforts of conserving natural resources.
