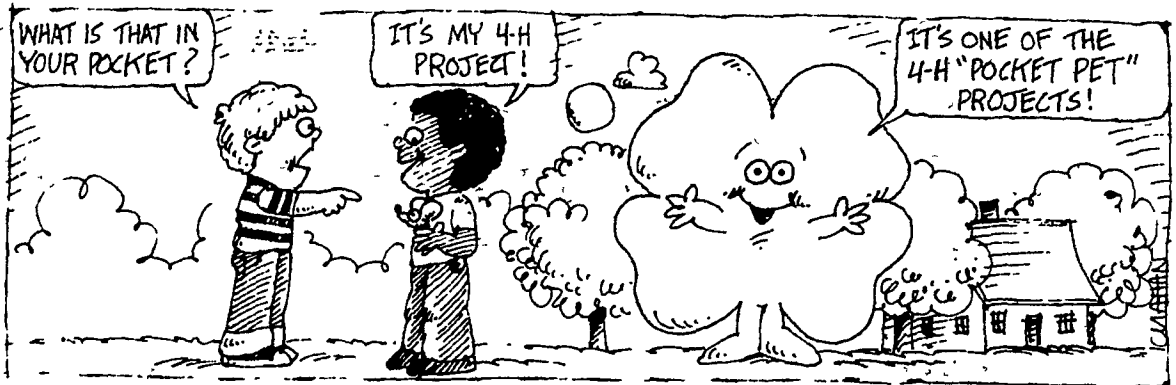

Nippenose Club presents holiday program

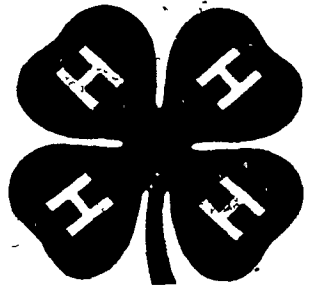

The program consisted of three poems, some Christmas songs, one holiday story and the story of the birth of Jesus.

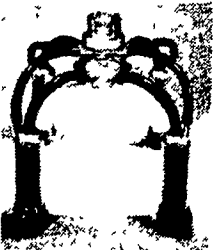

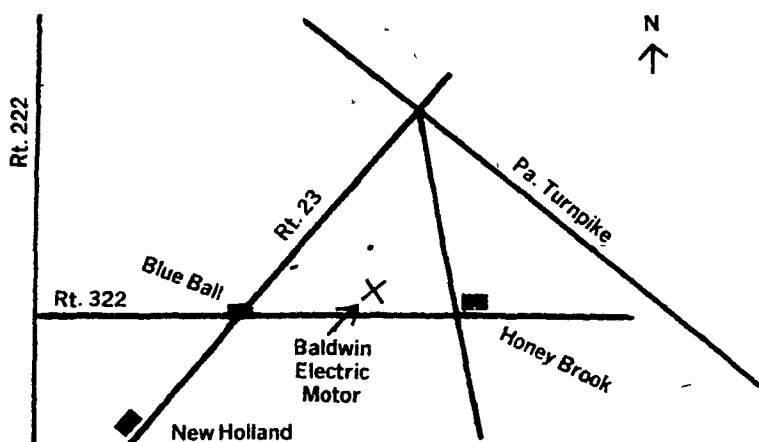
