**Research probes for answers
to wet corn**

ATLANTA, Ga. — Excessive moisture in hybrid corn at harvest is a problem for growers in all areas of the country. A new plant breeding procedure for im-

proving the rate of moisture loss from the ears of early corn has been developed and tested at North Dakota State University, according to Harold Cross, NDSU agronomist.

Cross reported on the new procedure at the 73rd annual meeting of the American Society of Agronomy here.

"We've known for a long time that there are differences among hybrids," Cross said. "Some lose moisture very rapidly once they are mature while others stay wet for a greater length of time."

Ideally, the corn should grow as long as possible to produce maximum yield and then dry down fast in time for harvest, he said. The problem is if it grows too long it becomes very wet and does not dry down fast enough. If the corn is not dry enough at harvest,

the combine will damage the seed coat, causing the kernel to deteriorate rapidly.

"We're selecting for a strain with the lowest ear moisture at harvest," Cross said. Although strains with this characteristic do have slightly reduced yields, he said he hopes to perfect the procedure later taking yield into consideration.

The procedure involves picking the ear of the corn when it is almost mature and still wet, and weighing it back each day to monitor how fast it loses moisture, he said.

Over a period of three years, five groups of corn were developed and tested indoors and later in the field. The original group was monitored the first year for moisture content and dry-down rate, Cross said. The strains that lost moisture fastest were selected and mixed together to increase the frequency of the gene for that trait. The same was done with the strains that lost moisture at the slowest rate. The next year the procedure was repeated.

Although the slow-drying group dried down slower, after one year of selection it averaged 4 percent lower moisture at harvest than the original group, he said. This was due to the fact that it had the lowest moisture to start with (at maturity). The second year of selection decreased the moisture of the slow-drying group another 4 percent, a total decrease in moisture from 32 to 24 percent.

"In terms of making progress from selection, it is very unusual that we were able to change something that drastically in such a short time," Cross said. "We're optimistic that we can simplify the procedure to come up with lower ear moisture at harvest, and later possibly modify it to increase the yield also."
