

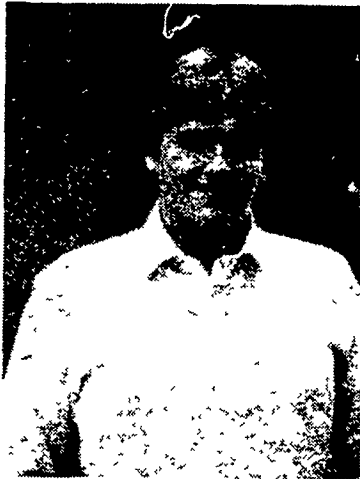

He is a member of the parliamentary procedure team, the citrus committee and the Market Hog Show committee.

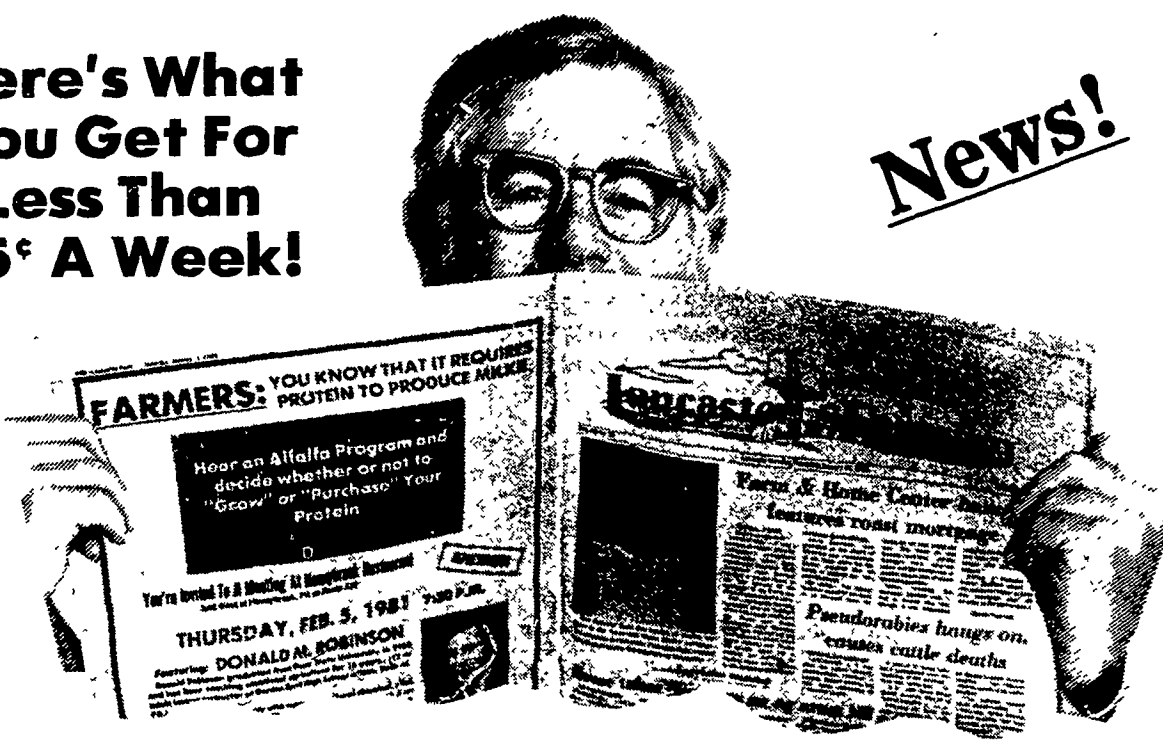
He was his chapter's Star Greenhand and received the Bedford-Blair-Fulton Farming Program plaque.
