"The 'We're Growing Better' logo campaign has been adopted by 160 Pennsylvania food processors," he said, "while 800 farm markets and 1,000 retail food stores are now using the logo to identify Pennsylvania foods.'

Hallowell urged the public to stop at the Pennsylvania Food Marketplace while at the Farm Show. "The Marketplace gives you a chance to 'take a taste' of the many food products from Pennsylvania agriculture," he said.

## **Broiler placements down 2 percent**



percent below the comparable period a year ago.


