

# Lancaster Guernsey makes comeback-'champion-style'

**FARM SHOW** — Guernsey show judge John Morris said Elsie and Scott Wolff's Guernsey was "a real working cow," Tuesday morning and with that, the Farm Show had another grand champion. But the Lancaster County couple

could have received a "thank you for entering" instead as a result of a dreadful night during last year's Farm Show.

The Wolffs' grand champ, England Farms H. Mill arrived at Farm Show 1981 with a sore foot. The night before the Guernsey

show, she received a penicillin shot and almost immediately broke into hives, a sign of an allergic reaction.

The show vet, said Elsie, was temporarily out of the building, when Mill received a dose of an-

tihistamine to counteract the hives, but her conditioned worsened.

Elsie Wolff watched in horror as her top animal fought to breathe. "Her udder and vein turned blue — almost purple," remembered

Elsie.

The cow began hallucinating, broke a few halters and managed to run free. Lee Yost, business manager for the Pennsylvania Guernsey Breeders retrieved the
