Show judge John Morris tagged Seed's 4-year-old Advancer Sleeper Milestone daughter grand champion. Top-O-Hill Milestone Tempty was also named senior champion and best uddered cow.

Top-O-Hill Glitter, a senior call and paternal sister to the grand champion kept the winning in the tamily and captured the Junior Champion title.

The R.A. Sollenbergers of Everett also compiled quite a winning record before the day ended. Taking several blue and red ribbons throughout the competition, the Bedford County family capped their showing with an aged cow entry, Ralaine Superb Cello. Owned by Leon Sollenberger, the BS Noble Superb daughter captured Reserve Grand and Reserve Senior Champion

In the youth division, Marilyn Deaven of Fredericksburg won the Grand and Senior Championships with her 4-year-old Golden Faithful daughter, Faithful Advancer Coleen. Marilyn is a member of the Northern Lebanon FFA Chapter.

Another Golden Faithful daughter, Top-O-Hill Golden Touch, captured the Junior Champion title. The junior

yearling was exhibited by Anna Uhlman of West Chester.

Elizabeth G. Wollaston of Maple Lawn Farm, Toughkenamen and a member of the Mann 4-H Dairy Club, won the Reserve Grand and Reserve Senior championships with Napoleon Maple Lawn Rocky. The 4-year-old cow is sired by Summetz Napoleon.

Franklin County youth, Denise Martin of Guifford Springs, Chambersburg, exhibited the reserve junior champion, Top-O-Hill TNT Carmel, a senior yearling.




