HARRISBURG - The Pennsylvania Cattlemen's Association held its annual membership meeting on Jan. 13 at the Pennsylvania Farm Show.



Haemophilus pleuropneumonia is a pneumoniacausing organism which kills with little advance warning You will probably not recognize the first signs of this disease - usually nothing more noticeable than hard-to-detect, shallow breathing. The first readily apparent indication of trouble is likely to be unexplained deaths in a herd which appeared to be perfectly healthy

The disease can spread rapidly, infecting more than half of the herd - of which 20% to 40% may die showing severe lesions of the lungs. Animals that do recover are generally slow growing, show poor feed

conversion, and are potential carriers of the disease. Administration may be either subcutaneous or intramuscular. Vaccinate at 8 weeks or older Revaccinate 3 weeks later.
