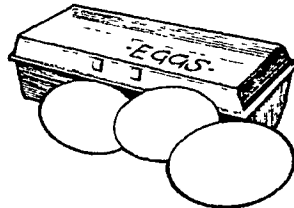

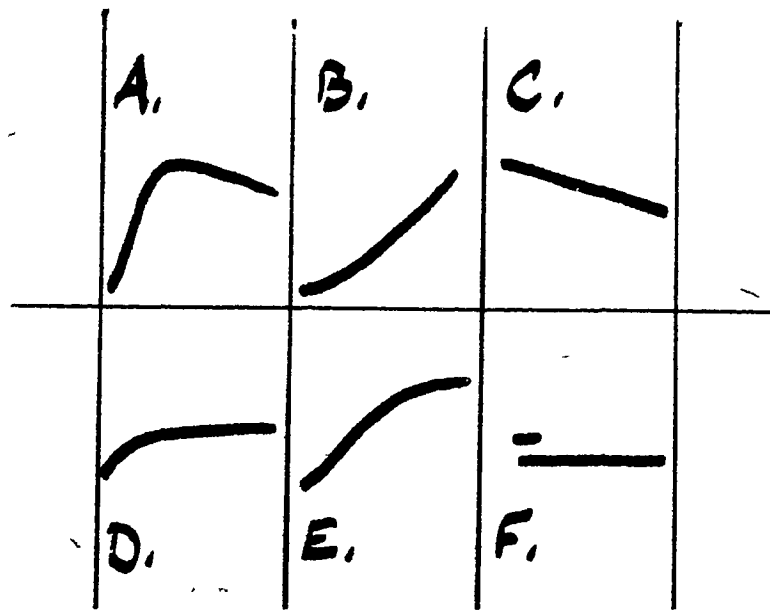
MARKET COMMENT: Demand fair with reports of resistance to higher prices. Supplies adequate.
