Slaughter Steer and Heifer prices advanced the forepart of the week in reaction to the forced weather related carcass beef trade on the close of the previous week. By midweek the winter weather lost it's grip and the live prices followed the downward trend established in the carcass and boxed beef. Receipts this week about 2500 as compared to 3505 a week ago and 3761 a year ago.

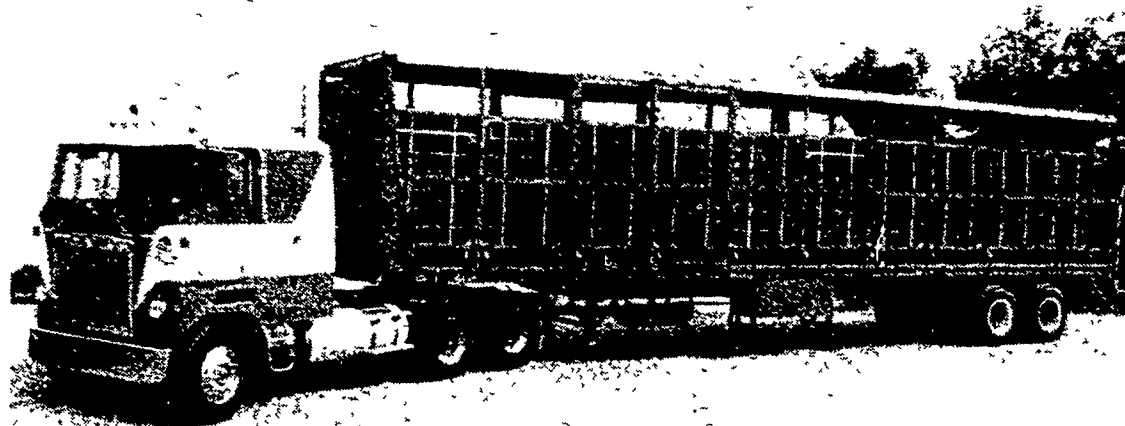
