Egg pricing to be revised

ATLANTA — The National Egg Pricing System Study Committee and Urner Barry Publications have reached agreement on a revised method of determining the value of cartoned eggs.

The agreement is now being reviewed by the U.S. Justice Department.

The plan calls for a three-member committee to determine the values, using nest run trading figures from Egg Clearinghouse as a basis. The committee would include two representatives of the study group and one from Urner Barry.
