

Pa. Polled Hereford consignment commands top bull price at Dixie Nat'l

JACKSON, Ms. — An overflow crowd at the 59th National Polled Hereford Sale packed the Trade Mart Building here at the Dixie National Livestock Show. The bidding was active throughout the sale, with the average price on the 15 females and interests in 23 bulls reaching \$7,825.

A price tag of \$15,000 for one-half interest accompanied the two top-selling bull lots, FLF Masterpiece and DJ Mpac 1191. Masterpiece was consigned by Falklands Farm, Schellsburg, Pa., and Busby Farm, Alexandria, Pa. Also sired by Entorcer 107H, the March 1979 bull was named the reserve grand champion at the 1981 Keystone International Standard of Perfection Show. Shotty Polled Herefords, Preshel, S.D., took him home on their top bid. DJ Mpac 1191, consigned by DJM Polled Herefords, Hawley, Texas, and Jimmy C. Farrington, Abilene, Texas, is a full brother to the National reserve junior champion bull and was purchased by Felix Marc of Uruguay.

Next on the roster of top-selling bulls was WSF Banner 9M, a son of Gold Standard Sire WSF PRL Justa Banner. Wooden Shoe Farms, Othello, Wash., sold three-fourths interest in him for \$15,500 to Triple C Ranch, Yamhill, Ore. Wooden Shoe also sold WSF Miss Banner 5M, a full sister to 9M, for \$9,500. She went home with Xanadu Stock Co., Seattle, Wash.

MW Ms Entorcer 5004 and her bull calf by Stibrk Gilead 67K

brought in the high bid of the day for Jack and Barbara Simpson of Hillsboro, Texas. The 2-year-old heifer and her calf stood second in class at the National Show and also claimed the championship title at the Oklahoma State Fair. Sired by Gold Standard Sire Entorcer 107H, 5004 commanded a price of \$25,000 from Moran Polled Herefords at Corsicana, Texas. Hubbards Polled Herefords, Canton, Texas, bought three-fourths interest in her September calf, JBS Enforced 67K N30, for \$6,000.

Triple H Ranch of Burlington, Iowa, led HHH Li Oakridge N6 into the sale ring to bring a \$15,000 bid for three-fourths interest. Doug and Barbara Walraven, Houston, Texas, bought this January 1981 son of BT Li Advancer 12H. M TJ Banner Impact hit a \$14,000 bid on three-fourths interest for Tjardes Farms, Gibson City, Ill., and Myrtlewood Farm, Lexington, Ky. A class winner at the 1981 Illinois and Wisconsin State Fairs, this son of WSF PRL Justa Banner sold to select Sires, Inc., Plain City, Ohio.

Graystone Farm of Schellsburg, Pa., led Graystone Engraver to a first place finish in class #19 and then took to the sale ring to bring \$13,000 for three-fourths interest. LuRose Estates, Hagerstown, Md., offered the top bid.

GH Ms Ju Banner 135M hit a price of \$15,500 for Gullikson Polled Herefords, Bath, S.D. Gladstone Farms, Nashville, Ind., bought this March 1980 daughter of

WSF PRL Justa Banner. Her show record includes the reserve junior championship at the 1981 American Royal Standard of Perfection Show.

F Nordica Viking came off a second place finish in her class at the National Show to sell for \$10,000. Check Point Ranches, Huson, Mont., consigned this heifer which sold to Glenkirk Farms, Maysville, Mo., and Klondike Farms, Ltd., Douglas, Man. A \$10,000 bid from Xanadu Stock Co., Seattle, Wash., bought EPH Maybel Lass 256M, by

Superior Sire BT CL Domino 15G. Edwards Polled Herefords, Harrison, Ark., sold this heifer.

Also selling for \$10,000 was PP Paytes Ace, a March 1981 son of Stibrk Gilead 67K. ACE Polled Herefords, Millbrook, N.Y., and Paytes Place, Charlestown, R.I., sold this bull to Priefert Farms, Fairmont, Neb. One-half interest in CC Apollonian 7K 102 consigned by Charles E. Boyd and Sons, Mays Lick, Ky., and Cathy Culp, Pleasantville, Ohio, sold for \$5,000. TWJ Farms, Carroll, Neb., was the buyer.

Rainbow End Ranch, Newberg, Ore., put up \$7,500 for JBS Pacemaker, sired by JBS Justa Jogger 101. Simpsons sold this bull in addition to two other bulls, JBS Tall Jogger M5 and JBS Gilead Vic N2. M5 sold to Dennis and Vila Morrell, Drain, Ore., on a bid of \$3,100, while N2 went to John H. Saringer, Kemp, Texas, for \$2,000.

Paul and Peggy Allen, St. Louis, Okla., sold three-fourths interest in GLA Vic Banner 126, a Justa Banner son, to Rudd and Bryson, Marshall, Okla., and Odell Gelvin, (Turn to Page D14)
