USDA asks for changes in margarine standard

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently proposed changes in its standard for margarine and oleomargarine to make them more consistent with international and Food and Drug Administration standards.

"Current USDA policy allows margarine manufacturers to prepare and label margarine according to Food and Drug Administration regulations," said USDA Food Safety and Inspection Service Administrator Donald L. Houston. "The new standard would make this policy formal and thus make the standard more compatible with current industry practice.'






