York Co. Society 26

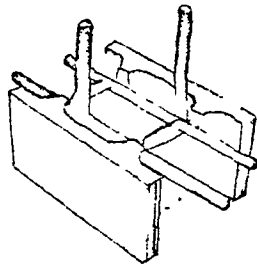

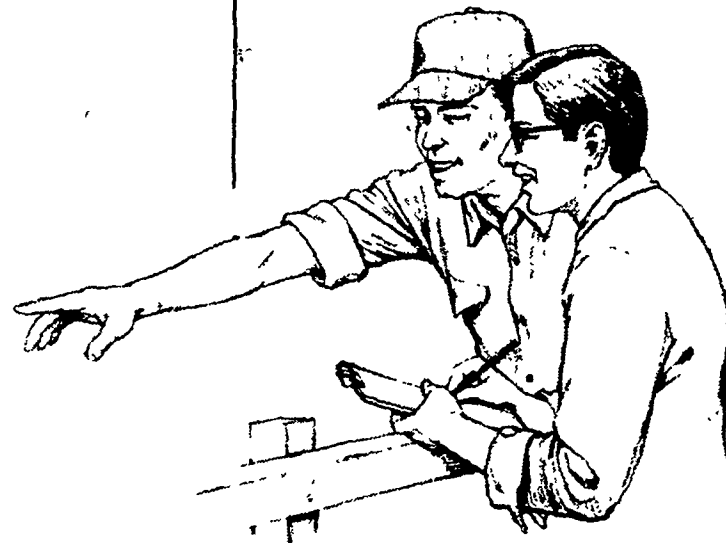
