DES MOINES, IOWA - Corn growers should not assume that a definable connection exists between soil fertility and the yield response of different hybrids. Even if there were data establishing a correlation between nutrient level and specific hybrids' performance, scientists say the wide range of environmental variables makes application of the concept impractical at this time.

'Make sure nutrient levels are adequate, especially nitrogen. But don't fertilize for the hybrid; fertilize for the yield you expect to achieve," advises Nicholas M. Frey, plant physiologist in the Department of Corn Breeding at Pioneer Hi-Bred International,

Frey says attempts to choose hybrids for specific soil fertility levels have drawn some attention recently. In those systems, hybrid selections are based on an assumption that hybrids respond

differently to various nutrient combinations.

The concept may be valid, but putting it into practice is another story. Frey cautions growers to examine all research data carefully before acting on matching recommendations hybrids to specific levels of soil fertility.

'The corn plant's response to fertility is an extremely complex research question," Frey explains. "Adding hybrid differences further complicates the issue.

"Also, fertility interacts closely with other environmental factors,' he adds. "A plant's nutrient uptake depends on availability of moisture, temperature, sunlight, soil type and tillage...even weed control.

'All these elements are related. I don't think there is any way to accurately select corn hybrids for their response to fertility alone."
