U.S. seed

exports reach \$111.5 million

WASHINGTON, D.C. — U.S. exports of seeds for planting totaled \$111.5 million for July-December, 1981. That's 17 percent below a year earlier.

December exports of \$39.6 million were 2 percent below December 1980. High interest rates and generally good supplies in importing countries as well as the strength of the U.S. dollar contributed to the slower export movement especially for forage seeds.

value of \$45.3 million, 41 percent of total seed exports. Forage seed exports were sluggish totaling \$28.8 million, 19 percent below the first half of the 1980-81 marketing year.

Grain and miscellaneous seed exports increased during December, bringing the six-month

totals for corn to \$16.7 million; sorghum, \$6.7 million, soybean, \$2.2 million and sugar beet seeds to \$900,000.

Mexico continues as the leading individual country market for U.S. seeds this year with \$18.1 million through December, 16 percent of total exports.

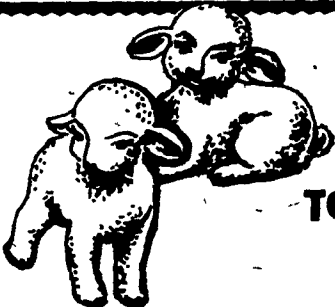
