GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. 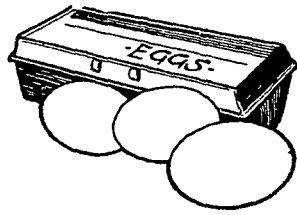

MARKET COMMENT: RTC movement for immediate shipment light on whole birds and one discontinuing needed in some quarters to try and clear inventories. Advance interest mixed. Some plants have noted improved inquiry while others still finding mostly quiet. Parts movement light to fair and generally better than whole birds, but some discounting noted. Slaughter schedules fairly heavy overall, live supplies fully adequate. Weights lighter than desired in most quarters. Undertone cautious.
