To be eligible for membership in the club, members must be between the ages of 8 and 18, and must own their own steer — preferably as soon as possible.

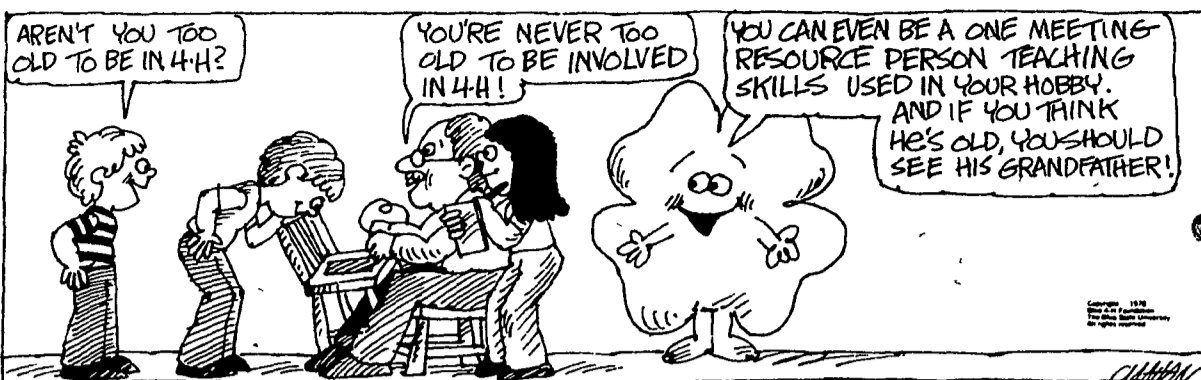

Want to be a bird watcher?

LANCASTER—If you want to avoid an "aerial traffic jam" in watching for birds returning from the south, use late March and early April to keep track of your favorite species, suggests Merril Wood, author of "Birds of Pennsylvania."

Normally, about 16 species arrive in mid-March, 23 in late March, and 20 species in early April. But by early May the "traffic pattern" for bird arrivals is somewhat congested with 41 species appearing, the peak time

for migrations.

Wood developed "Birds of Pennsylvania," a black and white manual, while associated with the Agricultural Experiment Station at the Pennsylvania State University. He is now retired from the faculty in zoology.

The guidebook lists the species migrating into, or through Pennsylvania during each month of the year. "Birds of Pennsylvania" is available for \$2.25, state tax and shipping charges included, from

Birds, Box 6000, University Park, PA 16802. Make checks payable to The Pennsylvania State University. Allow at least two weeks for delivery.

When driving to Penn State, you can pick up a copy in room 204 of the Agricultural Administration Building at the corner of Shortlidge and Curtin Roads.

The volume was revised in 1979 and describes briefly the 381 bird species normally reported in Pennsylvania.
