HARRISBURG -Egg production in Pennsylvania during February totaled 343 million, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service. February production was one percent above the 338 million eggs produced last February. The February average of 16.9 million layer hens was less than one percent below a year ago. Egg production per 100 layers was 2,034

compared with 1,996 in February 1981.

U.S. egg production totaled 5.33 billion eggs during February, one percent less than a year earlier. The number of layers on March 1 totaled 286 million, compared with 290 million a year earlier. Egg production per 100 layers during February was 1,850 compared with 1,658 a year ago.
