want to be part of any quota plan," Hanman said.

"If this is changing though, the Federation has another board meeting planned for April 27."

While Jeffords' proposed bill has some regional aspects to it and is aimed at the Northeast, Hanman said that dairy industry support must not be regionalized.

The only other bill that has thus far come to light is one proposed by Steve Gunderson, Congressman from Wisconsin.

It was explained that the Gunderson proposal also contains quotas, but differs from that of Jeffers in that pricing penalties for farmers for over-production would be graduated depending on the amount of surplus produced.

Report evaluates new design for shell egg packing plant layouts

WASHINGTON, D.C.—A report just issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture evaluates the efficiency of a new egg shell-packing plant based on a modular design recommended by USDA.

By improving product and material flow, and increasing operating space, the new plant proves to be 18 percent more efficient than its predecessor.

In contrast to the original facility, the modular plant features a straight flow layout that improves efficiency through improved handling methods, main-

tenance of egg quality, and the ability to expand the plant at minimum cost without hampering ongoing operations. Improved sanitation and safety conditions for employees were included in the modular plant design.
