Control water weeds now

UNIVERSITY PARK — Plan now to deal with aquatic weed problems, says Terry D. Rader, Extension urban forest-wildlife specialist at Penn State.

"Aquatic plants are already growing rapidly in many farm ponds and the longer one waits, the more difficult it will be to control aquatic weeds," he explained.

Control aquatic weeds early to prevent the flowering plants from producing seed, Rader recommends. Seed will produce another crop of weeds the year following treatment even though the current year's growth may be controlled. Eliminating aquatic weeds before they have a chance to set seed will

reduce the vegetation problem for a number of years as well as eliminating their current year's growth, he explains.

Chemical treatment results in dead plant materials in the pond. These dead plant materials decompose and remove dissolved oxygen from the water in the process. The greater the amount of plant material decomposing, the greater the amount of dissolved oxygen depletion.

Oxygen depletion may be so severe that fish and other aquatic organisms suffocate. Early chemical treatment results in less dead plant material and decreases chances for a fish kill from a lack of oxygen.

Rader says the best temperature to control weeds is above 60 degrees. Most ponds in Pennsylvania will hit 60 degrees sometime in May, so now is the time to get ready.

Rader cautions pond owners to

obtain a permit for chemical treatment of aquatic vegetation. A permit is required by law. Applications for the permit are available from County Extension Offices, or Pennsylvania Fish Commission Regional Offices or the Pennsylvania Fish Commission, Fisheries Management Section, Robinson Lane, Bellefonte, Pa. 16823.

Processing the application takes time and is one more reason to start early. The permit is required only if chemicals are to be used.

If chemicals are used, label instructions should be followed to the letter, adds Rader. Under state and federal pesticide laws, pesticide labels are legal documents and pesticide users are held responsible for the safe use of chemicals.

"Regardless of the control methods, start early to minimize future problems and to enjoy a week-free pond all summer.
