Elected were: president, Matthew Arrowsmith; vice president, Mark Welk; secretary, Deb Hershberger; treasurer, Melissa

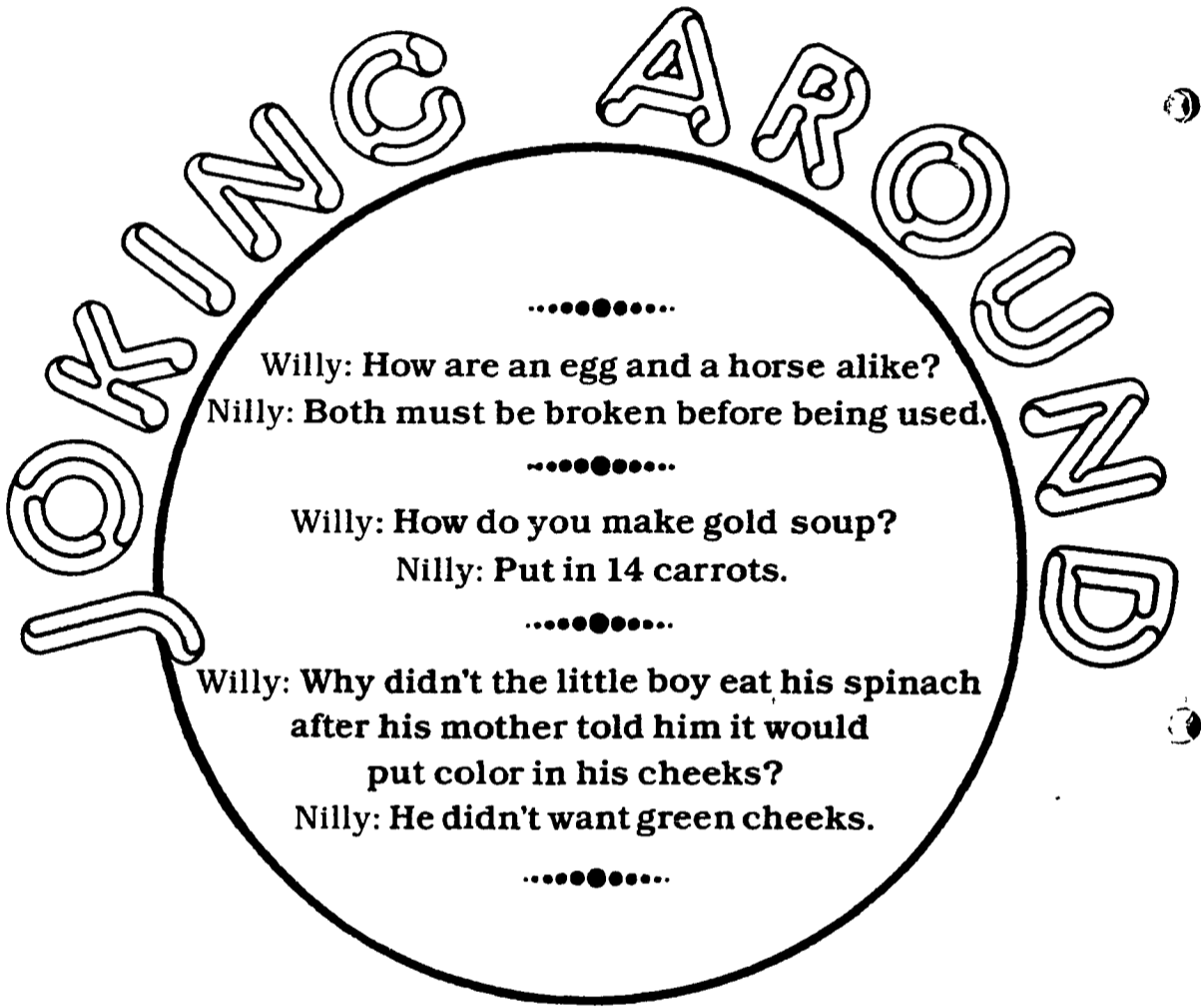
