Md. Extension director addresses ag alumni

COLLEGE PARK, Md. -- "The Cooperative Extension Service has functioned best in trying times," says Craig S. Oliver, director for the University of Maryland's statewide outreach program.

Oliver was the principal speaker last month during the seventeenth annual University of Maryland agriculture alumni fellowship night at the Peter Pan Inn near Urbana.

He told a near-record crowd of 180 persons that "we will not stand by and fail because we were afraid to make organizational changes."

Oliver noted that "Extension mirrors the society in which it works. Maryland can be proud of its Extension heritage.

He observed that Maryland leads the nation in no-tillage Extension and research programs. And the state is noted for highquality Extension publications, which are available free at county Extension offices.

The Maryland director declared that "the Cooperative Extension Service must be on the cutting edge. But we may have to take a step back before we can go forward again." He mentioned moving back to basic skills.

By contrast, a new computerized Estel project now being introduced on the lower Eastern Shore will enable both farmers and homemakers to tap into space-age electronic technology for the latest information on weather, markets and current research. This system is expected to be available on a statewide basis by 1984.

Following Oliver's talk, awards of excellence were presented to five individuals by John R. Remsberg, Jr., of Middletown, Frederick County, president of the College of Agriculture Alumni chapter of the University of Maryland Alumni Association-International.
