Derrwyn Ultra Mindy, a senior yearling exhibited by Brian Derr of Taneytown, collected a Junior Champion win in the open division. The Quality Ultimate daughter is out of Derrwyn Admiral Kelly.

Reserve Junior Champion honors went to a "Reserve," of another sort. Kents Reserve Rorae Asta was the senior yearling entry of Marlon F. Andrew of Centreville. Out of Gillbrook Astronedia, Andrew's reserve champ is sired by Elevation.

A CTamelane Rockman Senator son walked off with Grand Champion bull honors. OCS Dairy Superman, a yearling bull, is owned by Patricia Zimmerman of Frederick and Roscoe Harbaugh of Thurmont. The young bull is out of Emperor Susan Marqus King went with a younger bull

for reserve champion. Lady's Manor Complete Rae-Twin, stood first in his bull calf class before claiming the reserve title. The Elevation son, owned by My Lady's Manor Farm of Monkton, is out of Lady's Manor Complete Gold who has records to 25,980 pounds of milk and 970 pounds of fat as a 5-year-old.

MD-Gaywinds Fury Angel, a Rosemere Fury Ivan daughter, placed third in her 5-year-old class, but topped all entries in milk to take the overall production award. Owned by Gaywinds Farm of Keymar, the "wet" Holstein turned in a winning record of 30,355 pounds of milk and 1,094 pounds of fat.

When the last class ended and points were tallied, the Premier Breeder and Exhibitor banners went to Kingstead Farms of Damascus.
